

Purple Weeping

Weeping European Beech

(*Fagus sylvatica Purpurea Pendula*)



Developed in Germany about 1865, this strictly weeping specimen is a real beauty. Its flexible branches adapt well to training, or if left to grow naturally, the weeping branches arch and sprawl to create an impressive, purple-black mound.
